127 children in K3-4th grades attended Penfield Montessori and 25% had an Individualized Education Program (IEP). 80% of children who received annual Individualized Education Plans (IEPs) in January- February 2021 are on target to meet their current goals by early 2022.

Supporting Families



Penfield Montessori continued to provide a quality and inclusive Montessori education for students of all abilities despite the challenges of the pandemic. In the fall of 2020, we began the school year with 100% virtual instruction. Our comprehensive learning plan included:

- Class lessons on Zoom that covered core academic subjects, social-emotional learning, physical fitness, and health/wellness.
- Online learning platforms, including IXL for math and Lexia for reading that targeted Common Core State Standards and key academic skills.
- Telehealth therapy and special education services for children with Individualized Education Plans (IEPs).



Penfield Montessori provided meals and at-home Montessori learning kits, or "MILK" kits to all families each week. These kits included books, math and spelling materials, clocks, and more to aid with virtual learning.

Penfield Montessori partnered with a variety of community agencies to provide students and families with engaging educational and cultural experiences. These partnerships included:

- Marquette University Department of Physical Therapy: offered adaptive gym classes that accommodated students with mobility challenges and physical disabilities.
- ACTS Housing and St. Michael's Church: connected families to community resources and neighborhood initiatives.
- **Playworks:** provided training for Penfield Montessori teachers on how to lead cooperative group games during recess. For remote learning, Playworks created movement activities, games, and "brain breaks" that students could play in their living rooms with at-home supplies.
- **Mount Mary University:** an art therapy student offered art therapy lessons that taught children how to express themselves and process their feelings through creative techniques, such as drawing, painting, coloring, and collage.
- United Performing Arts Fund (UPAF): provided workshops and family-friendly performances from professional arts organizations in Milwaukee, such as Danceworks and the Florentine Opera.
